

DISMISSAL

Student dismissal begins at 2:05pm. Allow busses room to turn into the drive safely and ensure the safety of students boarding and exiting busses. Do NOT pass busses. Do NOT pull out to pass other cars waiting for students. We will make every effort to expedite drop-off/pick-up times for you. Remain in your vehicle. We will assist your child. Students will only be released to a designated adult on the Daily Dismissal List and recognized by staff. ALL DISMISSAL CHANGES must be processed through the front office. Please do NOT email, text, or Facebook message teachers a change during the day.

ARRIVAL

Front doors open at 7:05am. Doors will remain locked until that time. Please do not drop your child off before this time. There is no one to watch them. Our instructional day begins promptly at 7:35am. Students that are tardy must be signed in by an adult. Please do not just drop off your child - You need to come sign them in! If for any reason you need to come into the building you must park in one of our designated parking spots. Please DO NOT PASS in our drop off/pick-up line! You may also not enter the bus loop for any reason. Thank you.

Smithsonian Museum of Natural History Field Trip

Dear Parents/Guardians,

On Tuesday, October 24th, all FRE students will be attending a field trip to the Smithsonian National Museum of Natural History in Washington, DC. We will leave Fountain Rock Elementary promptly at **7:45 am** and **return at approximately 4pm**. **Your student should arrive at Fountain Rock no later than 7:30 am** in order to eat breakfast and meet up with their assigned group prior to boarding the busses.

All Kindergarten and First Grade Students **MUST** have a chaperone!! Students in grades 2-5 will be placed in groups no larger than five. Chaperones for students in grades 2-5 will be on a first come, first serve basis. **NOTE** - Each year we have parents ask if they can follow the bus. While this is fine please understand that your child **WILL** be assigned to a chaperone and **MUST** stay with that chaperone throughout the trip - No exceptions. You will be responsible for meeting up with their group once you find parking. Again, you may not pull your child from the group - you must stay with their assigned group. If you are chaperoning we will communicate via the Remind app. Please be sure that we have your most up to date cell phone number on file.

All chaperones are required to complete our volunteer training (this must only be done once so if you completed the online training last year you are good to go!) & fill out a volunteer form. Volunteer forms must be completed each year per WCPS policy. A volunteer form is attached. The training presentation can be accessed at freelementary.weebly.com.

Thanks to our wonderful PTA and our partnership with the Downsville Ruritan this field trip is **FREE** for all students! The cost for chaperones is \$10 which includes admission to the IMAX movie and the cost of transportation.

Students & Chaperones will need to bring a packed lunch. If you would like a bagged lunch provided by our cafeteria, please check the box below so that we may order it in advance. If your child is ordering from the cafeteria, their lunch account will be billed what they normally pay for lunch. (free, reduced, or full price)...

Lastly, **the attached permission slip must be completed and returned to the school** in order for your student to attend.

We will return to Fountain Rock by 4 pm which is after regular dismissal hours and students will need to be picked up at that time.

WANT TO HELP YOUR CHILD BE A MORE FLUENT READER? ENSURE THEY KNOW THE FOLLOWING WORDS...

The Fry Sight Words list is a more modern list of words than the [Dolch list](#), and was extended to capture the most common 1,000 words. Dr. Edward Fry developed this expanded list in the 1950s (and updated it in 1980), based on the most common words to appear in reading materials used in Grades 3–9. Learning all 1,000 words in the Fry list would equip a child to read about 90% of the words in a typical book, newspaper, or website.

The Fry words are listed by the frequency with which they occur and are often broken down into groups of 100. So the first 100 Fry words are the 100 most frequently occurring words in the English language.


